

Allergy/Asthma Student Checklist

Child CAN NOT attend school without medication(s) and proper paperwork

Medication

- Brand new, unopened medication in original packaging
- Prescription label included (unless over the counter medication) with child's name listed.

Forms

Can be located and printed from our website <https://www.mthebronnursery.org/forms>

Required for students with allergies:

- (1) *Allergy Action Plan* **signed** by doctor which lists ALL medications being stored at school.
 - Child's photo on Allergy Action Plan
- Medication Administration Form* **signed** by doctor- There needs to be (1) form for EACH medication. For example, if you have an EpiPen and Benadryl, you must have (2) Medication Administration forms; one for each.
 - Child's photo on Medication Administration Form

Required for students with inhalers at school:

- Asthma Action Plan* **signed** by doctor. Must accompany *Medication Administration Form* and *Allergy Action Plan* (if allergy induced asthma)

Required for other medical conditions which could occur at school, (ex: heart condition, low blood sugar, etc.)

- Emergency Medical Plan* **signed** by doctor
 - Child's photo on Emergency Medical Plan

REMINDERS:

- PLEASE CHECK MEDICATION EXPIRATION DATES
- EACH MEDICATION MUST BE LABELED WITH PRESCRIPTION LABEL (UNLESS OVER THE COUNTER). THIS INCLUDES THE LABEL ON AN EPIPEN BOX WITH CHILD'S NAME LISTED
- ALL FORMS MUST BE SIGNED BY A DOCTOR
- MHNS CAN NOT KEEP ANY MEDICATIONS ON PREMISES WITHOUT THE PROPER PAPERWORK
- ALL OF THE ABOVE FORMS NEED TO BE SUBMITTED EVERY SCHOOL YEAR; IF YOU ARE A RETURNING STUDENT WE NEED ALL NEW FORMS
